Los Alamos Police Department Releases Report on Home Search Uncovering Potential Lab Property

LOS ALAMOS, NM—The Los Alamos Police Department released a report this morning that documents the October 17th arrest of a Los Alamos resident and the seizure of drugs, drug paraphernalia and items potentially owned by the Los Alamos National Laboratory located in Los Alamos County.

Last Tuesday, October 17th, Los Alamos County police officers responded to a reported domestic disturbance at 2025 East Jemez Road. During the course of their investigation, they arrested Justin Stone, 20, on an outstanding Magistrate Court bench warrant for probation violation. Officers at the scene discovered items indicating possible drug activity. With this information, a search warrant for the residence was obtained and served. Several drugs and drug paraphernalia were confiscated. Mr. Stone is currently being held at the Los Alamos County Jail.

During the course of the search, officers realized that some of the items seized appeared to belong to the Los Alamos National Laboratory. The Los Alamos Laboratory Security Division was contacted for analysis and confirmation, and the evidence and its handling was deemed a federal jurisdictional issue. At that point, the matter was referred to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The County's police department is not involved in the FBI case.

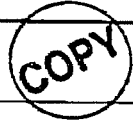

On October 17, 2006 at approximately 1616 hours, Corporal Gonzales and I were dispatched to Royal Crest Trailer park to a report of a domestic disturbance near space 252 [REDACTED]

██████████. Dispatched advised that the reporting party said they were out front throwing rocks through the windows of the trailer. On my arrival to the area I observed that the trailer at space #250 had the front windows broken. The reporting party an ██████████ at ██████████ came out and advised that the subjects had gone inside the trailer. I approached the front door of the residence and could hear voices inside. Corporal Gonzales knocked on the door and identified us and asked for someone to come to the door. We received no response. I went to the front of the trailer to look inside and could see a young female in a striped shirt sitting in the living room talking to someone that I could not see. I identified myself speaking through one of the broken windows and asked the female to come to the door. I observed two rocks on the kitchen floor that appeared to have been used to break the windows. She did not move at first and I heard the male subject stomp off to the back of the residence before she came and opened the door.

The female identified herself as ██████████ and said that there was no fighting taking place. She advised that Justin was upset because someone had tried to break inside the house last night and did the damage to the windows. She said he had called someone on the phone and was yelling at them because he thought they had done the damage. I did not observe any marks or signs of battery to her person. We asked her where the male subject was at and she only said that he left and was not here. I asked her who the male subject was that she was arguing with. ██████████ asked if she had to tell us, and we advised that she need to tell us who it was and what was going on. She said the male subject was Justin and she thought he had left. I asked if it was Justin Stone and she advised it was him. I had knowledge that we had a outstanding arrest warrant for Stone and Corporal Gonzales called dispatch to confirm that the warrant was still valid. We then began a search of the residence for Mr. Stone, and found that two bedrooms in the back of the trailer had locked doors. I called for additional assistance in case Stone had either escaped out of the back or had barricaded himself in the room. I went outside the residence while Corporal Gonzales remained at the door. I was unable to look through any of the windows as they were covered, however they were not open and it appeared that Stone was still inside one of the bedrooms. Corporal Doug Johnson and Detective Andrew Goldie arrived and took positions outside. I went back inside where we repeatedly knocked on the doors and told Stone that he should come out and give himself up.

Stone answered me and specifically asked if he could have a cigarette before he gave himself up and went to jail because he knew about the arrest warrant. I advised him that if he opened the door and talked to me that I would allow him to have a couple cigarettes before he was taken to jail. Justin Stone opened the door and sat down on the bed with a lit cigarette. I asked him about the fight with his girlfriend. He related the same story that ██████████ had told me earlier about a break in attempt and said he had called a possible suspect and was yelling at him. I did not observe any signs of a battery on his person. I asked Stone if he was renting the place and he said no, that it was owned by Jessica Quintana and that she just let him stay here a couple days a week. I observed a YMCA ID card hanging off the bed next to Stone with the name and picture of Jessica Quintana. After Stone had smoked a cigarette, Corporal Gonzales had him stand up and placed him under arrest and in handcuffs. He was taken outside and placed in a patrol unit. While inside the residence with the subjects, I had observed several suspicious items in plain view. The kitchen area had a glass pipe on a shelf and a can of automotive brake fluid. On a counter top was a large Crown Royal bag full of something. Corporal Johnson patted the bag as part of a protective sweep for weapons and it sounded like the bag might contain a large amount of coins. On the living room floor was a yellow propane canister. In the back bedroom while talking with Justin Stone I had observed a home made pipe made from a plastic beverage bottle. On another shelf was a propane torch and canister. We had all parties exit the residence and I spoke to the other officers who had also observe items associated with drug paraphernalia. Detective Andrew Goldie went and secured a search warrant while I remained at the residence, keeping it secure. I called

Jessica Quintana on her cell phone (██████████) from a number provided to me by Justin Stone. Quintana agreed to meet with me but never showed up at the residence or the police department.

Upon being granted a search warrant of the property we entered again and collected the items we had observed and some others from the residence and rear shed on the property. The search was done by Detective Goldie and Corporal Gonzales while I assisted and wrote items down for the return and inventory list. See list and supplemental reports for all items recovered. A copy of the warrant and list was left at the residence. The house was secured prior to leaving the scene. I recommend this case be active and referred to investigations for a follow up interview with Jessica Quintana.

On October 17, 2006 at approximately 1616 hours, Sgt. Chuck Ney I were dispatched to Royal Crest Trailer Park # 252 in reference to a domestic dispute. Upon my arrival the front window was broken and I approached the front door and heard several voices. I knocked on the door and a male subject answered "who's there". I answered Police department and there was silence. I continued to knock on the door and a female subject (████████████████████) answered the door and asked why were there. We advised her of the call and she stated that she was there by herself. After we advised her that we heard a male subject inside and we needed to check the welfare of everybody at the residence due to the nature of the call. She let Sgt. Ney and I inside the residence and we asked her who the male subject was and she stated "Justin Stone". Sgt. Ney advised me that there was a warrant for Mr. Stone at which time I confirmed the warrant with dispatch. After obtaining the information from dispatch that the warrant was still active we began to check the interior to locate him. We were able to check the entire residence except for two rooms which were located to the rear of the residence.

Cpl. Doug Johnson and Detective Andrew Goldie arrived on scene and secured the exterior of the residence. Sgt. Ney continued knocked on the locked door and advised Mr. Stone that he needed to give himself up. After several minutes Mr. Stone answered and asked Sgt. Ney specifically if he could have a cigarette before he goes to jail. Sgt. Ney advised him that he could and Mr. Stone opened the door. Sgt. Ney questioned Mr. Stone about the possible disturbance and he stated that someone attempted to break into the residence last date and that he was talking to the person he thought was the suspect. He then advised that he kick the broken window with his foot to get the loose glass off the pane. Sgt. Ney asked Mr. Stone if he was renting the residence and he stated no, that it is owned by Jessica Quintana and she has let him stay there the past couple of weeks. There were no signs of battery on either Mr. Stone or ██████████ and she was released form the scene. While Sgt. Ney was speaking with Mr. Stone, I observed a plastic homemade type bong on a shelf in the southwest corner of the room and propane bottle with the torch tip intact on a shelf located on the northside of the room.

I took Mr. Stone into custody for the outstanding warrant and placed him into my unit. All officers exited the residence right after I did at which time it we had a discussion in regards to the drug paraphernalia each officer had observed in plainview. I transported Mr. Stone to the detention center and booked him accordingly. At this time he received a copy of the warrant. Sgt. Ney remained at the scene and secured residence while Detective Andrew Goldie proceeded to the police department and obtained a search warrant.

Once the search warrant was completed and approved we re-entered the residence and executed the search warrant. The drug paraphernalia which was in plainview as well as other items which were located in the residence and from a shed located at the rear of the property were recovered. Sgt. Ney completed the return and inventory list of all items that were recovered. The residence was secured and a copy of the executed search warrant and a list of property that was confiscated was left at the residence.

On 10/17/2006 I was requested to respond to a domestic disturbance call at 2025 East Jemez Rd. #250 by Sgt. Ney. Upon arrival I met with Sgt. Ney and Cpl. Gonzales who initially responded to the call. Sgt. Ney told me that he had arrested Justin Stone for an outstanding warrant. Sgt. Ney, Cpl. Gonzales and I did a protective sweep of the residence to ensure that there were no more people in the residence. During the arrest and protective sweep we noticed a number of glass pipes with burnt residue throughout the residence as well as a small digital scale in the immediate area where Stone had been arrested.

We all then exited the residence and secured the area. Sgt. Ney kept the scene secure while Cpl. Gonzales and I obtained a search warrant for the residence. We had our warrant approved by the Office of the District Attorney then had Magistrate Court Judge Casados sign the search warrant.

On 10/17/2006 at about 1930 hours Sgt. Ney, Cpl. Gonzales and I, Det. Goldie, served the search warrant on 2025 East Jemez Rd #250. During the course of the search we found numerous glass pipes with burnt marijuana residue. Two of these pipes were found in the immediate area where Justin Stone had been. I spoke with Stone who said that the pipes did not belong to him. I then spoke with the owner of the residence, Jessica Quintana, who said that most of the pipes belonged to Stone but that she was the owner of at least one of the glass pipes. Cpl. Johnson and I then processed the evidence. We tested a piece of cotton that was packed into a rubber bladder. The rubber bladder was attached to some plastic tubing and was packed with what appeared to be kitty litter and cotton. The presumptive test for methamphetamine came back positive on the piece of cotton we tested.

This case is referred to the Office of the District Attorney for review on the following charges on the owner of the residence Jessica Quintana:

- 30-31-23: Possession of controlled substance (methamphetamine: schedule I controlled substance as defined in 30-31-6).
- 30-31-25.1: Possession, delivery or manufacture of drug paraphernalia

Affiant states that within the past 4.5 years he has participated in the seizure of small and medium sized quantities of illegal narcotics.

On Tuesday, October 17, 2006, Sgt. Ney advised Affiant, that he was involved in an incident that occurred at 2025 East Jemez Rd #250 on 10/17/2006 at about 1616 hours. Sgt. Ney stated, he responded to 2025 East Jemez Rd #250 on a call of a domestic disturbance. The resident(s) in the area of 2025 East Jemez Rd #250 had made contact with the Los Alamos Police Department because the resident(s) were concerned about a possible domestic battery. Sgt. Ney arrived at the scene and made contact with the occupants.

Upon contact with the occupants of 2025 East Jemez Rd. #250 Sgt. Ney learned that Jessica Collins had been in an argument with her boyfriend identified as Justin Stone. Sgt. Ney had knowledge that Stone had a felony arrest warrant that was currently active. Sgt. Ney then confirmed the warrant with dispatch. Sgt. Ney then made contact with Stone who had locked himself in the back bedroom. Sgt. Ney spoke with Stone through the door who refused to open the door. Stone said that if he could have a cigarette that he would come out of the bedroom. Sgt. Ney said that he could and Stone emerged from the bedroom. Sgt. Ney then placed Stone under arrest and placed him in the back of a police car.

Sgt. Ney noticed when Stone came out of the bedroom that there were several glass pipes in the room with burnt residue. Sgt. Ney also noticed a small propane torch and a home made device which appeared to be made for smoking controlled substance. While taking Stone to the transport unit Sgt. Ney also noticed that there were several more glass pipes with burnt residue in the kitchen. Sgt. Ney also noticed a purple Crown Royal bag full of unknown denominations of US currency near the front door of the residence. Stone admitted during the course of the arrest that "He was tired of this life of drugs".

Based on the above information, Affiant respectfully requests that this warrant be granted under the auspices of the District Court, County of Los Alamos, State of New Mexico.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

The above named defendant has been arrested without a warrant for the following reasons (set forth in plain, concise and definitive statement of facts establishing probable cause):

On 10/17/2006 I was requested to respond to a domestic disturbance call at 2025 East Jemez Rd. #250 by Sgt. Ney. Upon arrival I met with Sgt. Ney and Cpl. Gonzales who initially responded to the call. Sgt. Ney told me that he had arrested Justin Stone for an outstanding warrant. Sgt. Ney, Cpl. Gonzales and I did a protective sweep of the residence to ensure that there were no more people in the residence.
