MEMORANDUM FOR MR. RICHARD BARLOW

SUBJECT: Reinstatement of Department of Defense Security Clearance for Access to Classified
Information

This addresses the status of your DoD security clearance.

You have expressed concern that the recent suspension and reinstatement of your clearance may cause reservations by hiring officials who may be considering you for future appointment to sensitive positions requiring clearance for access to sensitive information.

I am pleased to be able to provide you with this letter, which certifies the reinstatement of the security clearance and which may be used by you to so inform interested hiring officials. Please feel free as well to use this memorandum as supporting any claim you may need to make that, after thorough examination by the Defense Investigative Service, and adjudication by the Security Division, this Directorate, of the issue precipitating the referenced suspension, any question of your trustworthiness for access to sensitive information was resolved in a manner completely favorable to you.

For your future reference, this office renders determinations of the eligibility for access to classified information of applicants, assignees, detailees, and consultants to, and employees of, the Office of the Secretary of Defense and those agencies administratively supported by it. We also render the same determination on employees of committee, subcommittee, personal staffs, and agencies of, the United States Congress, when so requested by members of congress through the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Legislative Affairs.

In sum, there is in my judgment no reason why your current security clearance, issued by this office, may not be reciprocally transferred to another DoD agency where a hiring official may so desire.

I trust you will find this information helpful.
